9	Secretary, Peter C. Jeong, read the notice for the 129 th Annual Shareholders Meeting.
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11	CONFIRM QUORUM
12	Inspector of Election, Karen Maas, verified that 20% quorum had been achieved with 4,418
13	proxy shares.
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15	APPROVE MINUTES OF 2023 ANNUAL SHAREHOLDER MEETING
16	Secretary, Peter C. Jeong, recommended that the reading of the 2023 annual shareholder
17	meeting minutes be waived in consideration of time and approved as written. The motion
18	was moved, seconded, and carried.
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20	GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT
21	General Manager, Ken Tcheng, presented the General Managers report.
22	- 2023 water production decreased 10% due to conservation efforts.
23	- Water quality meets all Federal and State standards.
24	- Basin WaterMaster cost for fiscal year 2023 was \$607,523.

12		o Replaced 2,600' of existing 6" mainline piping on Reno with new 8" pipe
13		from Hermosa to Longden.
14		o Modernized 15-year-old SCADA pump control system server hardware and
15		software.
16		o A Water Conservation program was implemented last year that helped us
17		reduce production by 10%.

19		o Replace 1,200ft of existing 6" mainline piping on Rosemead (West side of
20		street) with new 12" pipe from Emperor to Longden.
21		o Implement Reservoir 4 bypass piping from La Presa to El Campo on
22		Huntington Dr in preparation for future Reservoir 4 rehabilitation project.
23		o Perform engineering work in preparation for future Reservoir 4 rehabilitation
24		project.
25		 Modernize SCADA remote control units at 6 locations.
